The first quarter of 2023 was an eventful one for the Sushma Swaraj Institute of Foreign Service (SSIFS), with both training verticals of the institute organizing several flagship programmes for Indian diplomats, civil servants, and officials as well as foreign diplomats.

The Induction Training Programme for Indian Foreign Service Officer Trainees of 2022 batch and two diplomats from Bhutan resumed in the New Year which included addresses by senior officers of Ministry of External Affairs and other eminent guest speakers. As is customary, the Officer Trainees were sent on 'Bharat Darshan'. They also attended State Attachment during which they receive briefings on the latest initiatives of the respective State Governments, the potential for international cooperation and the developmental challenges faced by aspirational districts in these states. The Officer Trainees also got a unique opportunity for hands-on training in protocol and media management during the G20 Foreign Ministers' Meeting held in March 2023.

The Mid-Career Training programme for 27 IFS Officers of 2007 batch was conducted from 06-31 March 2023.

As part of SSIFS's efforts to train officials involved with the G20 meetings, a day-long training programme for Protocol Officers from States & Union Territories was organized on January 27, 2023. This followed the first training programme for more than 300 Gol Liaison officers held in December, 2022.

As far as training for officials at junior level is concerned, the 85<sup>th</sup> edition of the Integrated Mission Accounting System (IMAS) and Immigration, Visa and Foreigners Registration and Tracking training programmes (IVFRT) were conducted in February-March, 2023.

Under the Foreign Training vertical, the year began with the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Disarmament & International Security Affairs Fellowship Programme was conducted in January 2023 where 34 young diplomats from 30 countries participated. There were also special courses for 21 diplomats from Iran and 17 diplomats from 9 Pacific Island countries (PIC) in February and March, 2023. The 64<sup>th</sup> and 65<sup>th</sup> edition of the Know India Programme for young PIOs was also conducted by SSIFS during this quarter.

The quarter ended with SSIFS's flagship training programme - 70<sup>th</sup> Professional Course for Foreign Diplomats - conducted from 13-31 March 2023 where 52 diplomats from as many countries attended.

The next quarter also promises to be an equally exciting one and we at SSIFS look forward to bringing out the details of our institute's activities through the next edition of 'Videsh Sewa'.

## Training for Indian Foreign Service (IFS) Officers

### Mid Career Training Programme -II

## 3<sup>rd</sup> Disarmament & International Security Affairs Fellowship Programme

As a part of India's commitment to promote arms control, disarmament and non-proliferation education under UNGA Resolution 71/57 "United Nations study on disarmament and non-proliferation education" and in line with the focus on "Disarmament Education" in UNSG's Disarmament Agenda 'to Secure our World and our Future', the Sushma Swaraj Institute of Foreign Service (SSIFS), in collaboration with the Disarmament and International Security Affairs Division (D&ISA) of the Ministry of External Affairs of India, conducted the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Disarmament and International Security Affairs Fellowship Programme from 09-27 January 2023 at SSIFS. Thirty-four young diplomats from thirty countries from across the globe participated in this programme. Both

international and domestic speakers from the world of disarmament affairs addressed the participants of the Fellowship Programme which was inaugurated on 09 January 2023 by Secretary (West), Amb. Sanjay Verma, who delivered the Keynote Address. The 3<sup>rd</sup> D&ISA Fellows undertook visits to Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) facilities in Bengaluru and Department of Atomic Energy in Mumbai [including a half-day visit to BARC in Trombay with visits to the Dhruva experimental reactor, food technology division (food irradiation) and the waste immobilization plant (harvesting nuclear waste for societal uses)]. Foreign Secretary, Shri Vinay Mohan Kwatra graced the Valedictory Ceremony at Jawaharlal Nehru Bhawan on 27 January 2023.

The Special Course was inaugurated on 06 February 2023 by Dean (SSIFS), Amb. Sanjiv Ranjan. The training programme included modules on India's foreign policy, India's relations with Iran, India's relations with its neighbouring countries, UN reforms, role of connectivity, India's success story in its pandemic response, food security,

Gol's economic initiatives and economic reforms, digital empowerment, climate change, multilateral diplomacy, negotiation skills etc. There were also sessions on Ayurveda and various facets of Indian culture. The 70th edition of SSIFS' flagship programme, the Professional Course for Foreign Diplomats (PCFD), was successfully conducted from 13–31 March 2023. Fifty-two young diplomats from fifty-two countries participated in the programme.

PCFD, which started in 1992, is the flagship programme for training of foreign diplomats. Held twice a year, in spring and autumn, it affirms India's commitment to its partner countries in sharing the knowledge and

expertise acquired in the field of diplomats' training.

The 70th PCFD was inaugurated on 13 March 2023 by Dean (SSIFS), Amb. Sanjiv Ranjan, who delivered the Inaugural Address. MOS for External Affairs & Education, Dr. Rajkumar Ranjan Singh, was the Chief Guest at the Valedictory Ceremony held on 31 March 2023.

The programme included sessions on various topics

including India's foreign policy, key international issues, multilateral diplomacy and diplomatic skills. There were also sessions on Ayurveda and Yoga. The participants got an exposure to modern India's economic and technological developments. They also

undertook study tours both within and outside Delhi to experience the rich cultural heritage of India. The participants made interesting country presentations at the end of their training stint with SSIFS.

## Know India Programme (KIP)

Orientation Sessions for the 64th and 65th Know India Programmes (KIP) were organized by SSIFS in collaboration with MEA's OIA-II (Overseas Indian Affairs-II) Division on 04 January 2023 attended by 37 young Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) from thirteen countries and on 07 February 2023 attended by 38 PIOs from eleven countries respectively.
